## Ocean Literacy Unit Vocabulary

Ocean the whole body of saltwater that covers nearly three fourths of the surface of the earth

**Literacy** the quality or state of being literate; educated

**Ecosystem** all of the living and nonliving things in an area; the complex of a community of organisms and its

environment functioning as an ecological unit

**Species** a group of similar living things that ranks below the genus in scientific classification; a class of

individuals having common attributes and designated by a common name

**Extinct** no longer existing

**Conservation** a careful preservation and protection of something

**Principle** idea or belief; a comprehensive and fundamental law, doctrine, or assumption

**Geology** a science that deals with the history of the earth and its life, especially as recorded in rocks

Weathering the action of the weather conditions in altering the color, texture, composition, or form of exposed

objects

**Erosion** the action or process of eroding which is to wear away by the action of water, wind, or glacial ice

**Tectonic plate** the plates which float and travel over the mantle

**Tsunami** a great sea wave produced especially by submarine earth movement or volcanic eruption

**Atmosphere** the gaseous envelope of a celestial body (such as a planet); the whole mass of air surrounding

the earth

Habitable capable of being lived in

Photosynthesis the process in which green plants use sunlight to make their own food; the synthesis of chemical

compounds with the aid of radiant energy and especially light

**Organism** a living thing; an individual constituted to carry on the activities of life by means of parts or organs

more or less separate in function but mutually dependent: a living being

**Sediment** material deposited by water, wind or glaciers

**Collaboration** to work jointly with others or together especially in an intellectual endeavor

Natural gas gas manufactured from organic matter

**Overfishing** to fish to the detriment of (a fishing ground) or to the depletion of (a kind of organism)

**Dam** a barrier preventing the flow of water or of loose solid materials

**Pollution** the act of polluting especially by environmental contamination with man-made waste

**Acid rain** rain that has increased acidity caused by environmental factors (such as atmospheric pollutants)

Greenhouse gas is any of various gaseous compounds (such as carbon dioxide or methane) that, trap heat in the

atmosphere, and contribute to the warming of the surface and lower atmosphere of a planet

Marine biologist a scientist who studies life in the sea
